REACH and RoHS Declaration

REACH DECLARATION

The EU (European) REACH Regulation (RL 1907/2006 EG) demands **Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemical** substances.

REACH entered into force on June 16, 2014 with the aim of improving the protection of human health and the environment through better and earlier identification of the intrinsic properties of chemical substances.

The REACH regulation obliges suppliers to inform customers of the presence of Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) in excess of 0.1% by weight, as updated on **23 April 2018**.

EU announced on June 27th, 2018 an updated list of the candidate 191 SVHC chemicals. The list can be found at:

Based on the material content certifications provided by Fero suppliers, none of these substances are present in the materials we use in our products, including packing and shipping materials. Therefore, Fero products do not contain any of these SVHC in excess of 0.1% by weight.

ROHS DECLARATION

The EU **Restriction of Hazardous Substances** Directive restricts the use of lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium and two brominated-flame retardants PBB and PBDE in electrical and electronic products sold in Europe after July 1, 2006. Fero certifies that to its knowledge products, which are designated to be RoHS compliant, meet the requirements of Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council (including the updated 2018 Directive).
